A. Overview

1. Research project title *

Maximum 30 words

2. Field of study

3. Host institution *

The location at which it is planned research will be carried out.

4. Coapplicants

In approximate order of significance, enter each coapplicant's email address and click Search. If there is no existing account for this email address you will be prompted to enter the required details.

5. Abstract of research project *

Explain the research project, and its significance to cancer prevention or treatment. Maximum 500 words.

6. Media summary of research or project *

Explain the research project, and its significance to cancer prevention or treatment, in language understandable to the public as a press release. Maximum 200 words.

7. Proposed duration of research

B. Description of proposed research project

Outline your project under the following headings, describing the research you propose to undertake. Do not exceed 3,000 words in total, excluding references.

Current combined total: 0 words.

1. Background *

Include relevance to cancer prevention or treatment, and possible future work if applicable.

2. Objective, hypothesis, design and methods *

Include descriptions of planned statistical analyses (or analytical methods if proposing qualitative research) demonstrating how you will address the research hypothesis, and give a justification of the sample size. For clinical trials the protocol should be attached in field [5] below.

3. Māori advancement and/or responsiveness to other groups *

Consideration should be given to how the research will contribute to the health needs of Māori (and other groups, such as Pasifika), recognising that the most appropriate approach to advancing Māori health will vary by the type of research and consideration should be context-specific, as determined by the nature and scope of the research. Describe any consultation undertaken.

4. Relevant previous work *

- Briefly provide evidence that the team has the
- qualifications, experience and knowledge in the proposed research area;
 - right mix of expertise, and appropriate networks and collaborations;
 - history of productivity and delivery; and
 - the right research environment.

Describe any clinical or other collaboration underway. Declare any career disruptions that may be relevant to your career history. Outline previous or current research by the applicants relevant to this application.

5. Attachments

Attach

- any clinical trials protocols,
- any images, figures, charts or diagrams referred to in the above sections and necessary for a full understanding of your proposal.
